I'm Victor Hurlbert. I'm the Clay County Auditor. One of the main roles of county government in a lot of ways, in the way Missouri law and how we're structured, is property tax collection. And you know that happens on an annual basis. All the your property tax bills are due at the end of the year, and you pay the county collector all that money isn't going to the county. It's for other taxing jurisdictions, like school districts, like cities, and all sorts of various local governments.

And so, one of the challenges with that is having a good partner in the banking system to be able to adequately track and disperse all those monies. It's a tremendous obligation & responsibility on the county's part.

We take care of different vendor payments, the different departments that have to get the different vendors that are paid.

I'm on the phone with Commerce. Every time I turn around, they're coming up with something new to help us make sure that things are being streamlined and that we're being protected.
